






North Shore Mass Clinic Quality Improvement

Background (Plan)

Problem: Low attendance of Mass vaccine clinics (Nicolet 2022)
Aim/Goal: For the 2023 flu season, hold at least 2 Mass Clinic Exercises for NS Residents 6mo and up

Goal: Increase the number of people vaccinated at the two proposed clinic times by at least 50% (Nicolet 2022: 40 people vaccinated)



Methods/Intervention (Do)

- Offer more accessible hours: after work instead of during the workday
- Utilize E-signage in front of school
- Partner with School Nurses, School Districts, and Parks and Rec Depts
- Limit the number of total clinics and double down on communications
- Streamline as much as possible, and replicate planning and operational processes where able





Conclusions/Implications (Act)

- Partner with School Districts
- Cater messaging to parents
- Continue to offer more accessible times
- All parties invited to engage in AARs


Outcomes: 2023 Flu Season

Program Evaluation Results

- The DATCP conducted an evaluation of the NSEHC agent program from November 6-10th.
- The evaluation verified the NSEHC is in compliance with applicable state statutes, codes, regulations and departmental policy.
- DATCP verified the 2022 annual self-assessment, record review of licensed establishments from 2021-2023, and conducted field exercises with staff.

Program Evaluation Details and Feedback

- "We recognize and commend the NSHD management and their Boards for the commitment and support they have given to their Retail Food and Recreational Business Agent Program as an agent for DATCP."
- Signatures were obtained and properly documented for all reviewed reports.
 - 440 inspections for 2023



NSHD 2024 Budget

- Presented to the Brown Deer Village Board
- Waiting to hear from Milwaukee County re: CDBG
- Received PH Infrastructure Grant from DHS (\$190,900)
- New CM position was initially expected to be funded 50/50 NSHD/NSFR
 - Update: Entirety of the position is in the NSFR budget
 - NSHD will serve as a sub-contractor and manage the position
 - Once the NSFR Budget is passed (and the MOU between NSHD and NSFR is complete) the position should be posted for hiring in Jan 2024
- COVID funds are being strategically spent down
 - IT Contracted Services until December 31, 2028
- PHEP formula funding issue at the state: TBD outcome
- End of 2023, NSHD is looking \$300K surplus,

WPHA Public Health in Practice Presentation



Reason for Presentation: PHNs are vital part of the public health infrastructure and have been since the 1800s.

However, many are struggling to find where and how the PHN role fits into the shifting public health landscape. **PHN Timeline:** In order to know where we're going (PH3.0), we need to know our past, so we examined PHNs long history of protecting and promoting the public's health and how it has changed over time.

SWOT Analysis: We also asked the SER PHN Network to complete a SWOT Analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities & Threats) to better understand how local PHNs view their role.
