No Brown Deer Back to School Clinic:

Instead, offering clinic times for children who need vaccines to come to the office—Still free of charge!

- Flu Clinics: 3-4 mass Clinics
 September October
 - Brown Deer Community Center
 - Shorewood HS
 - NSHD Shorewood Office
 - Whitefish Bay Rec/HS TBD
- Fall Vaccines:
 - Influenza infants, children, adults, and 65+
- To be determined:
 - Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) vaccine was approved by CDC for 65+ and COVID (See update)

Updates:

COVID-19 vaccines are commercialized – meaning many vaccinating sites will return to "traditional" health care coverage

 CDC's Bridge Access program will allow us to vaccinate uninsured/underinsured adults

Important Date: August 28th – Joey will be attending the CDC BRIDGE ACCESS PROGRAM webinar detailing the change

Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP)

- Submitted PHEP and City Readiness Initiative (CRI) BP5 budget proposal – waiting for approval
- Self-directed objective:
 - Review, revise and/or develop internal policies to improve our public health preparedness and response operations, including policies relating to WEAVR, requesting emPOWER data, and integrating ESSENCE into our preparedness activities.
- Updating Region 7 Public Health Emergency Response Plan (PHERP)
- RNC Planning July 2024

PHEP Continued....

- Meeting with Nicolet High School staff and community preparedness partners next week –
 - Purpose is for local community agencies to come together and discuss what their role(s) and responsibilities are before and after a critical incident, if it were to occur at or near Nicolet.
- Updating our POD plans this budget period
 - POD = Point of Dispensing

Program Updates: Overdose to Action

- Received funding from DHS for harm reduction vending machine to go in lobby at Brown Deer Village Hall, which also houses BD Police and our department.
- \$50,000 for Nasal naloxone (Narcan), IM naloxone, and fentanyl test strips
- Competitive RFP forthcoming
- Added several new members to our OFR
- Motel 6 used our Narcan!



NSHD 2024 Budget

- Work in progress
- Seeking a 3.5% operational increase
 - Not sure yet where we will land
 - Met with some reluctance, still working on it!
- Budgeted a 1.5/2.0 raise for the team (6-month increments) to try and stay competitive in the market
- Budgeted 30K of spending down our fund balance, but confident that we won't need that
 - Applying for grants all the time
- New CM position 50% funded by NSHD, 50% NSFR and exploring additional options
- COVID funds are dwindling
- 5-year Public Health Infrastructure grant is forthcoming (waiting on contract) \$190,900

 - Continue to apply for grants and negotiate the position in the budget
- Ensure program visibility in all 7 NS communities
 - Summer event season has been busy
- Resolve ongoing human health hazard cases
 - Complete!

- Assess the workload of the PHNs
 - Made many changes, but still have some gaps we are working to fill
- Collaborate more often with HR
 - Yes, but stable staffing for the last 8 months
- Pursue new funding options
 - Public Health Vending Machine
 - CDBG—applied for more for 2024
 - Narcan Direct is coming back
