November 9, 2022: RSV and Other Respiratory Viruses

WHAT IS RSV?

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms. Recovery time for most people is between one and two weeks. However, RSV can become serious for infants and older adults.

On Friday, November 4th, 2022 The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is issued "a Health Alert Network (HAN) Health Advisory about early, elevated respiratory disease incidence caused by multiple viruses occurring especially among children." This has the possibility of placing increased strain on healthcare systems.

<u>DID YOU KNOW:</u> RSV is the most common cause of Bronchiolitis and Pneumonia in children under the age of 1yo in the US.

Co-circulation of respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), influenza viruses, SARS-CoV-2, and others could place stress on healthcare systems this fall and winter. This early increase in disease incidence highlights the importance of **optimizing respiratory virus prevention**, **including prompt vaccination and proper handwashing.**

Q: IS IT TOO LATE TO GET MY FLU SHOT?

A: NO! You should still get your flu Shot as soon as you can. Anyone ages 6-months and older are recommended to get their annual flu vaccine and stay up to date on their COVID-19 vaccines. 
