World Day for Safety and Health at Work

is an annual international campaign to promote safe, healthy and decent work. All workers should be afforded the right to a safe and healthy work environment.



Common Hazards at Work: Chemicals; radiation; loud noise; long working hours, shift work, or irregular work schedules; lifting, bending, and standing; extreme heat and cold exposure; physical stress or injury from repetitive motion; and vibration injuries.

Workers have the right to:

- Work in a safe place and receive safety training in a language that you understand.
- Ask questions if you don't understand instructions or if something seems unsafe.
- Use and be trained on required safety gear, such as hard hats, goggles, and earplugs.
- File a complaint with the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). To file a confidential complaint about workplace hazards, visit the OSHA website.
