Why vaccinate? Vaccination is one of the best ways parents can protect babies, children, and teens from dangerous diseases. Vaccine-preventable diseases can be very serious, even deadly, especially for young children. You can look up your child's record through the Wisconsin Immunization Registry (https://www.dhfswir.org/PR/clientSearch.do?langu age=en) to make sure they are up-to-date on all their vaccines.

The North Shore Health Department (NSHD) maintains an immunization program to prevent and control vaccine-preventable diseases. Under this program, NSHD provides immunizations to <u>residents</u> <u>without medical insurance, to those on Medicaid</u> <u>and to those whose insurance does not cover</u> <u>vaccines.</u> Please contact our office to check availability and make a vaccination appointment by calling 414-371-2980 or emailing: nshd@nshealthdept.org.

Health insurance typically covers vaccinations, so check with your child's physician about getting them immunized.

Beach Monitoring

Our department monitors the water quality at Atwater, Klode and Doctors Parks throughout the summer by testing the water at least twice weekly for the presence of *E. coli* bacteria. Based on test results, beaches are considered:

- Green: Open with no advisory,
- Yellow: Open with an advisory indicating caution should be used at the beach because of elevated bacteria levels, or
- Red: Beach may be closed due to highly elevated bacteria levels.
- <u>Visit the DNR for up-to-date Beach advisories or closures</u>
