Overdose is preventable.

International Overdose Awareness Day brings people together to help end overdose and spread the message of the tragedy of drug overdose death. It is also a day to end the stigma of drug overdose, remember those who have died, and acknowledge the grief of friends and family left behind.

Some of the goals of International Overdose Awareness Day include:

- To provide an opportunity for people to **publicly mourn loved** ones.
- To send a strong message to people who use drugs and people in recovery that they are **valued**.
- To inform people around the world about the **risk** of drug overdose.


