September 21, 2022: Be Prepared for Emergencies

National Preparedness Month is an observance each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time.

Make a Plan! Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes, so it is important to know which types of disasters could affect your area. Know how you'll contact one another and reconnect if separated. Establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find. Learn more about how to make a plan for emergencies.

Build an emergency kit! Consider unique needs of your family. Include supplies that might be needed by pets, older adults, and those with disabilities in the event of the emergency. Ready.gov/kit

Don't forget to include:

- Non-perishable food and water that can last several days
- Flashlights, radios & extra batteries
- First aid kit

BEFORE an emergency, teach your child how to dial 911. You should also teach kids when and how to call other important phone numbers.

Sign up to receive alerts through CodeRED

CodeRED is an emergency notification system that allows North Shore Public Safety Departments to send emergency notifications to subscribers via email, text and phone calls.

In case of an emergency, individuals within the effected geographic area will be notified via text, phone, or email. There is no need to sign up for lifethreatening emergency alerts.

To receive non-emergency public safety alerts, sign up by texting "NSALERTS" to 99411 or visit public.coderedweb.com/CNE/BF3ADE00A015 to enroll.

Availability of high-dose (65+) and Flublok (50+) is based on remaining supply. If you are interested in high-dose or Flublok, call 414-371-2980 so we can schedule you for an earlier date at one of our offices.

MONKEYPOX VACCINATION

AT NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

JYNNEOS vaccine is currently available for the following people:

- Known contacts who are identified by public health through case investigation, contact tracing, and risk exposure assessments.
- Presumed contacts who may meet the following criteria:
 - People who know that a sexual partner in the past 14 days was diagnosed with monkeypox.
 People who attended an event or venue where there was

known monkeypox exposure.
Gay men, bisexual men, trans men and women, any men who have sex with men, and gender non-conforming/non-binary people, who have had multiple sexual partners in the last 14 days.

• People considered to have an elevated risk of exposure to monkeypox in the future:

- Gay men, bisexual men, trans men and women, any men who have sex with men, and gender non-conforming/non-binary people who expect to have multiple or anonymous sex partners. This may include people living with HIV and people who take HIV pre-exposure.
- Clinical laboratory personnel who perform testing to diagnose orthopoxviruses.
- Research laboratory workers who directly handle cultures or animals contaminated or infected with orthopoxviruses that infect humans.
- Certain health care providers working in sexual health clinics or other specialty settings directly caring for patients with sexually transmitted infections.
