
September 28, 2022: Cold and Flu Season

It's that time of year – cold and flu season! And it can be hard to tell what is making you sick... Is it allergies? A common cold? Maybe the dreaded flu? Another virus?

Going back to school often means a higher likelihood of spreading colds, viruses, and germs, especially as it gets colder outside, and activities and events move inside. The flu can spread year-round, but the *fall and winter months are known as flu season, with flu cases peaking between December and February.* It's important to pay attention to how we or our family feels during this time, not to spread illness and recover quickly. *It's best to stay home when not feeling well. Also wearing a mask can help cut down on the spread of colds, viruses, flu, and germs, to others.*

We are able to bill some insurance for the full cost: Medicare, Medicaid, Humana, United Healthcare and Anthem (BlueCross BlueShield). If paying with cash or check, we can issue a receipt on-site to be submitted to your insurance company for reimbursement.

We also offer homebound flu vaccines! Call us to inquire.

18 years and under: \$10 (cannot bill insurance) Adult (quadrivalent): \$40 Preservative Free: \$45 Able to bill some insurance: Medicare, Medicaid, Humana, United Healthcare and Anthem (BlueCross BlueShield). Otherwise payment by cash or check.

Those who have received vaccines in Wisconsin. can access immunization history, vaccine recommendations and overdue vaccines, using WIR.

DO YOU KNOW HOW TO ACCESS YOUR **VACCINATION RECORD?**

COVID-19 vaccination cards contain the information needed to provide proof of vaccination. If the card is lost or additional vaccine history access is needed, the Wisconsin Immunization Registry (WIR) is an alternative solution.

Wisconsin Immunization Registry



Public vaccine record access allows people to look up their child's or their own vaccine record in WIR. Many people in Wisconsin receive vaccines from more than one doctor, or health care provider. Public access allows people to find their vaccine record quickly and efficiently no matter where they are in the state.

MONKEYPOX VACCINATION AT NORTH SHORE HEALTH DEPARTMENT

JYNNEOS vaccine is currently available for the following people:

- Known contacts who are identified by public health through case investigation, contact tracing, and risk exposure assessments.
- Presumed contacts who may meet the following criteria:
 - People who know that a sexual partner in the past 14 days was diagnosed with monkeypox.
 - People who attended an event or venue where there was known monkeypox exposure.
 - Gay men, bisexual men, trans men and women, any men who have sex with men, and gender non-conforming/non-binary people, who have had multiple sexual partners in the last 14 days.
- People considered to have an elevated risk of exposure to monkeypox in the future:
 - Gay men, bisexual men, trans men and women, any men who have sex with men, and gender non-conforming/nonbinary people who expect to have multiple or anonymous sex partners. This may include people living with HIV and people who take HIV pre-exposure.
 - Clinical laboratory personnel who perform testing to
 - Clinical laboratory personner who personne contact diagnose orthopoxviruses.
 Research laboratory workers who directly handle cultures or animals contaminated or infected with orthopoxviruses that infect humans.
 - Certain health care providers working in sexual health clinics or other specialty settings directly caring for patients with sexually transmitted infections.
