ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATES

ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATES

- Becky attended a 2-day strategic planning meeting with all the SE Region's health officers to build consensus and plan on our PHIG SRS. The goals are "enhancing assessment and surveillance & supporting access to care."
 - 3 buckets were identified: re-envision how we use our 2 monthly WALHDAB meetings, catalyze resources to maximize impact, and leverage technology to modernize public health
- Hired a regional Public Health Project Manager
 - Waiting on pre-employment screenings, but is slated to start June 4
 - Will manage the PHIG Regional Strategic Plan

ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATES

- Becky re-appointed to the WI State Lab of Hygiene Board of Directors
- Had a successful DATCP Program Evaluation at the end of February
- Carried on with Strategic Planning and CHIP Implementation
- Power of Connection was presented at ICC with NSHD, MCW, Sojourner Family Peace, and local constituents
- Building out Nightingale Notes, our new HER. Soft launch is next week
- Attended many board meetings to report on our annual report and our NSEHC fees

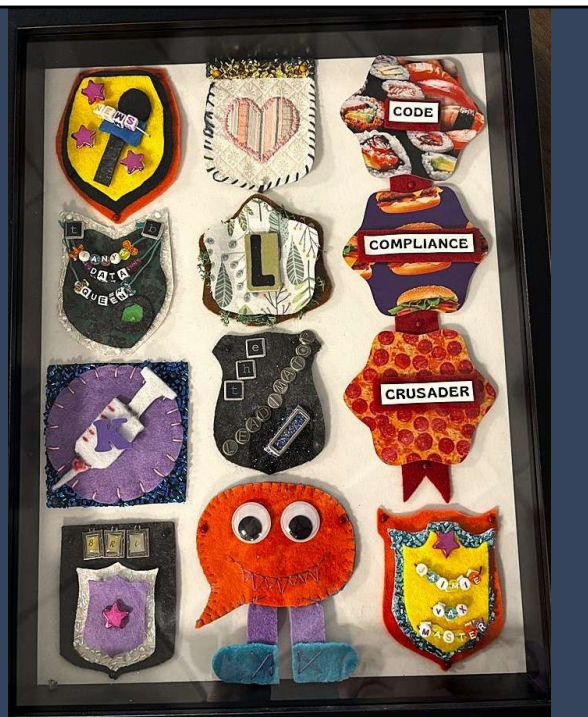
Becky hosted:

FUNDING UPDATES AND PLANNING

- Reviewed Q1 Financials on 5/18. Total expenditures were at 21.75% for 140 Fund (tax levy, 1/1 to 12/31 FY) and 14% for the 141 (grants, 9 different FYs, so actuals require pro-ration, but we're looking good).
- Bri wrote and was awarded a Climate Mini Grant (\$5000)
- Becky wrote and was awarded additional ARPA funds to support NPHW (\$5365)
- Almost done raising NSEHC fees. Two more meetings to go (Fox Point, Bayside)
 - These changes will increase the sustainability of this fee funded program



FUNDING UPDATES AND PLANNING

- May 18th: NSHD and MCW received preliminary notification of award for \$250K for CLEAR
 - Community-Led Education for Advance care Readiness
 - 2 years of funding with the option of a 3rd year no-cost extension (6/1/26-5/31/28)
- May 26th: NSHD and DW/WFB DPW received Cycle 2 LSLR funding, providing an additional \$300K for outreach and education around lead service line replacement (extended the contract 6 months)
- May 27th: Meeting with State DPH; 50% of our immunization funding is expected to be cut 7/1/26 (-\$8200)
 - Becky immediately engaged with the Secretary of DHS on the matter

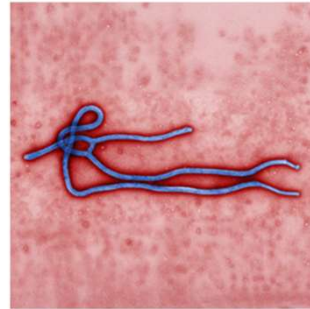

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE UPDATES

- Becky and PHNs are actively learning more specifics about Ebola and Hantavirus.
 - There are 22 travelers currently being monitored for symptoms of Ebola in Wisconsin. None in the North Shore.
- Today PHNs and Becky participated in a CDC COCA (Clinician Outreach and Communication Activity) Call for situational awareness around clinical requirements.
- Becky and Bri have been attending CDC All-STLT Calls and ad-hoc calls since 2022

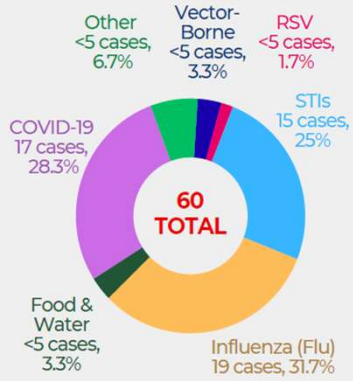

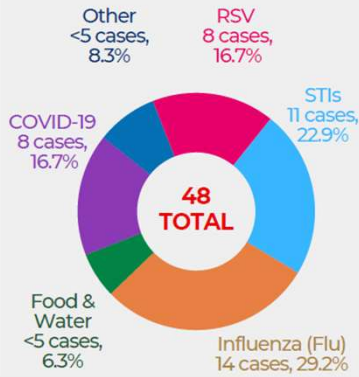

Probable and Confirmed Cases



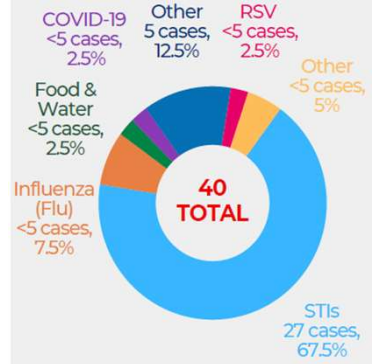

This dashboard shows respiratory virus activity and trajectories for the week ending on May 23, 2026.

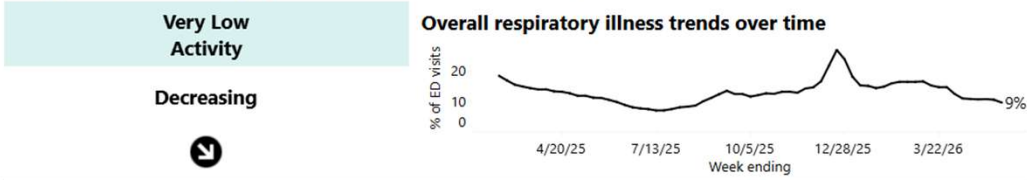

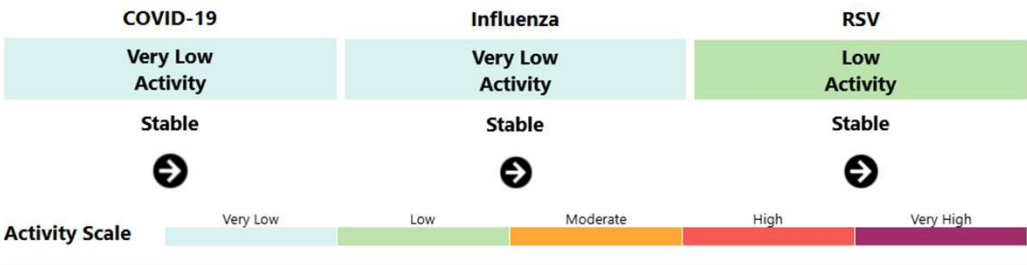

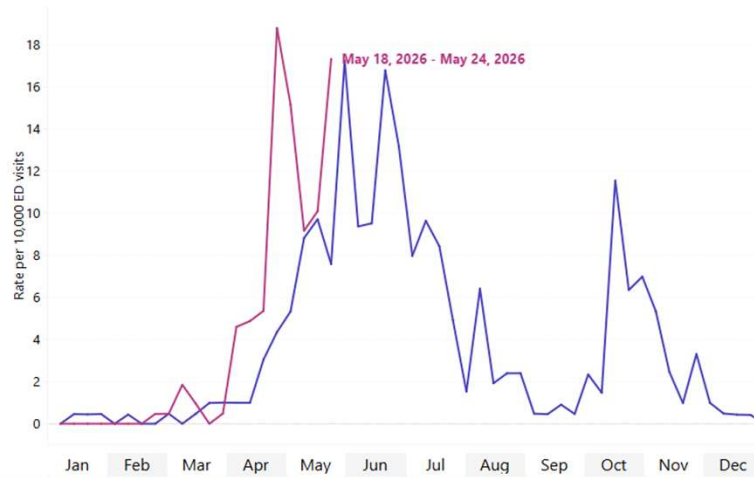

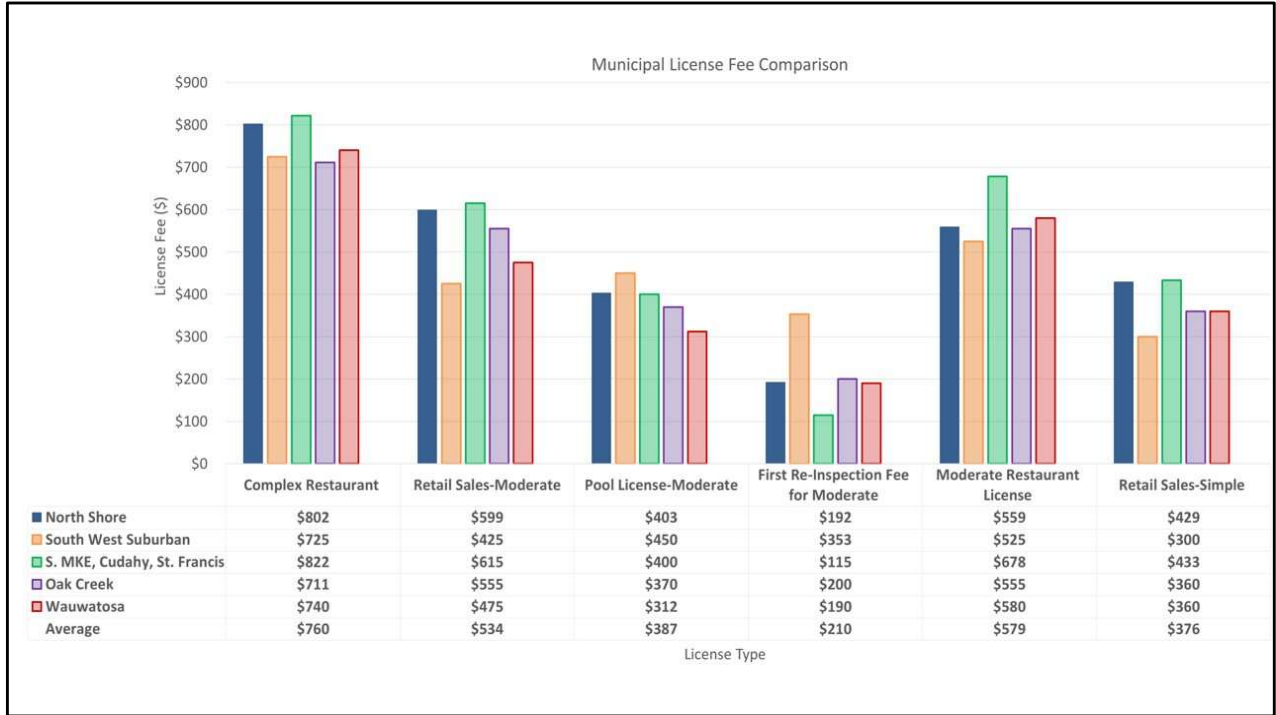
NSEHC FEE INCREASE

- To increase programmatic stability, we moved for a 15% Increase across the board.
- Passed Brown Deer, Shorewood, River Hills, Whitefish Bay, and Glendale
- Holding renewals for Bayside and Fox Point

**NSEHC
ORDINANCE
UPDATE**

- Historically, a fee was only charged for the second reinspection.
- For 2026-2027 licensing year and beyond, the definition of reinspection has been changed to clarify that when a reinspection is required, a fee will be assessed for the first and subsequent reinspection.
 - Criteria also removed from ordinance and placed in policy.
- In 2025-2026 licensing year we completed 133 reinspections without charge.
 - This is an estimated loss of fees and staff time to the tune of \$28,000 that will now be recuperated.



**ENVIRONMENTAL
HEALTH**

- 158 inspections completed since our last meeting
- NSEHC had a program evaluation closeout meeting with DATCP
- 11 animal bites
- 355 renewals issued
- Staff took 35 housing complaints
 - Most commonly for bugs, mold, and rodents
- Started beach testing May 21st

LEAD SERVICE LINE-SECOND QUARTER REVIEW

- Initial outreach materials were developed, reviewed, and printed
- Independently certified pitchers were purchased
- 36x48 poster for use at community events was designed and is under review

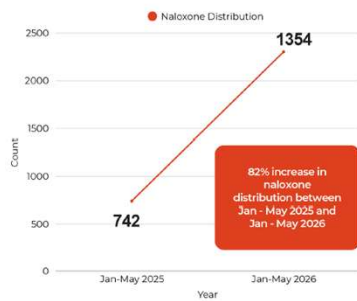

NATIONAL NURSES WEEK (MAY 6-12)

- The nursing team celebrated National Nurses Week by creating a reel for our socials where we explained what public health nursing is and why we chose it as a career path

EHR TRANSITION & DOCUMENTATION UPDATES

- Transitioned from ProVision to Nightingale Notes, a public health- specific EHR system managed by CHAMP Software
- Will support charting for immunization clinics, MCH visits, and animal bite/rabies reporting
- Goal is to create a more streamlined workflow, for documentation, data tracking, and annual reporting

ONGOING PLANNING & OUTREACH INITIATIVES

- Continuing planning for fall flu clinics and school immunization outreach efforts

VFC RE-ENROLLMENT

- Successfully completed VFC re-enrollment to continue offering free vaccines to children who qualify



OTHER UPDATES

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Certified Lactation Counselor (CLC)
 - Ashley and Bri both passed their certification exams and are now officially CLCs (after over 90 hours of coursework). They can now use this certification to better serve during lactation home visits and for community breastfeeding events.
- Bri and Tanya attended the 2026 Syndromic Surveillance Symposium
- Brad and Becky attended WPHA Conference, foodborne illness tabletop exercise, measles tabletop
- RNs attended virtual WI TB Summit (webinars every Tuesday for the entire month of April)
- Sam completed ICS 800 and ICS 400, as well as a variety of public health communication trainings
- Brook passed her Lead Risk Assessor Certification
