### November 2, 2022: Lung Cancer Awareness Month


Lung cancer is the most common cause of cancer death in the United States, responsible for more deaths in this country than colorectal cancer, breast cancer, and pancreatic cancer deaths combined.

### What is lung cancer?

Lung cancer occurs when cells in the lungs change (mutate), most often due to breathing in dangerous chemicals.

But lung cancer can happen without known exposure to toxic chemicals. Cancer cells grow wildly and cluster together to form a tumor, destroying healthy lung tissue around them.

There are two different types of lung cancer: small cell lung cancer (SCLC) and non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC). To learn about each type visit the American Lung Association's <a href="Lung Cancer Basics">Lung Cancer Basics</a>.



Causes and risk factors for lung cancer include:

- 1. Smoking
- 2. Secondhand smoke exposure
- 3. Radon
- 4. Hazardous chemicals
- 5. Particle pollution
- 6. Genes

### Often lung cancer does not cause symptoms until it has spread or are in advanced stages.

While it varies from person to person, when there are early signs, it can commonly include:

- A cough that is constant or worsens
- Coughing up blood or rust-colored spit or phlegm
- Chest pain that is often worse with deep breathing, coughing, or laughing
- Shorteness of breath
- New onset of wheezing
- Hoarseness
- Infections such as bronchitis and pneumonia that don't go away or keep coming back
- Fatigue, or feeling tired or week
- Loss of appetite
- Unexplained weight loss

If you notice any of these symptoms, you should seek medical assistance.

If you are a current or former smoker over the age of 50, you may meet the high-risk eligiblity criteria for low-dose lung cancer screening. Talk with your medical provider to learn more or visit the American Lung Association's About The New Low-Dose CT Lung Cancer Screening Test.
