The North Shore Health Department participated in a CDC study earlier in 2020 that was recently released as pre-print in the *Pediatrics* journal – [Symptoms and Transmission of SARS-CoV-2 Among Children-Utah and Wisconsin, March-May 2020](#)

The study looked at how SARS-CoV-2 spread within households, specifically to children. They found that among a cohort of household contacts of individuals with COVID-19, the rate of acquiring SARS-CoV-2 infection was similar between children and adults. Children who developed COVID-19 reported mild symptoms that were less frequent and severe than those experienced by adults.

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.
