


#### November 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020 as of 4:30 p.m.

The Northwest and Southside Health Centers will not be open for COVID-19 testing tomorrow. Wednesday November 11 because of Veterans Day. Miller Park testing will be open tomorrow from 11am-6pm.





Whichever location you plan to be at after you get your results is the address you should give when you get tested.

It is important if you test positive for public health worker's to know where you will be isolating at when we reach out to notify you.



For example, college students should give their college address if they plan to stay at that location, but if they are traveling to a home address or other location, that

address should be reported. This will make the notification process smoother and allow for efficient tracking of cases.
