Someone you saw on Thanksgiving test positive for COVID-19? If they were infectious during the Thanksgiving gathering, you may be at risk of infection. A person is considered infectious two days before they develop symptoms. For example, if your friend or relative started having symptoms on Saturday, November 28th and then tested positive for COVID-19 in the days following, they were infectious starting on Thursday, November 26th. If you had close contact with someone that tested positive, follow these recommendations for 14 days after your last date of contact, even if you test negative during this period: [Next Steps: close contacts of someone with COVID-19 \(wisconsin.gov\)](#)

You are a "close contact" if any of the following situations happened while you spent time with the person with COVID-19, even if they didn't have symptoms:

- Had direct physical contact with the person (for example, a hug, kiss, or handshake).
- Were within 6 feet of the person for a total of more than 15 minutes in a single day.
- Had contact with the person's respiratory secretions (for example, coughed or sneezed on; contact with a dirty tissue; shared a drinking glass, food, towels, or other personal items).
- Live with the person or stayed overnight for at least one night in a house with the person.

If you are sick, you should remain in isolation for:

- At least 24 hours after you are free of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and other symptoms have improved, **and**
- At least 10 days after the date you first had symptoms.

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.

14 days after your last contact with the diagnosed

If you are tested during your quarantine and the results are negative, **you still need to complete your full 14-day quarantine** before going back to work or being around others.

You could have been exposed to COVID-19 at some point and not enough time has passed for the test to pick it up.

You may test positive at a later date.
