COVID-19 VACCINE UPDATE

Wisconsin is currently in Phase 1A of vaccine prioritization. This includes frontline health care workers and long-term care facility residents and staff.

The North Shore Health Department is beginning to vaccinate Phase 1A this week. The Phase 1A vaccine clinics are by appointment only and are being made available to Phase 1A providers on a weekly basis.

There is a limited number of doses at this time. If you are a Phase 1A provider on our list you will be contacted individually.

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.
