North Shore Health Department COVID-19 Vaccine Update 1/29/21

Today, NSHD was notified by WI Department of Health Services to expect a very limited number of COVID-19 vaccine next week. We were informed we would receive around 100 first dose vaccines for the upcoming week. This is about 17% of the total amount we requested. With the continued demand for vaccine from the 1A providers, we have already filled our appointments for the week of February 1st and will not be sending out a sign-up for open appointments. The reduced supply is a disappointment for our health department as we had hoped to begin our vaccine clinics for adults aged 65 years and older.

NSHD will continue to request COVID-19 vaccine on a weekly basis. We will continue to share information on when and how eligible individuals will be able to sign up for our clinics on either the Friday or Monday of the upcoming week.

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.
