Due to the weather in the southern United States, there is uncertainty with the vaccine shipment dates. Therefore, next week NSHD will be sending out the **link to sign up on Tuesday, February 23rd, 2021 at 10:00am** for COVID-19 vaccine appointments for that week. With the high demand and limited supply, we expect these appointments will fill quickly. NSHD will only vaccinate currently eligible populations including:

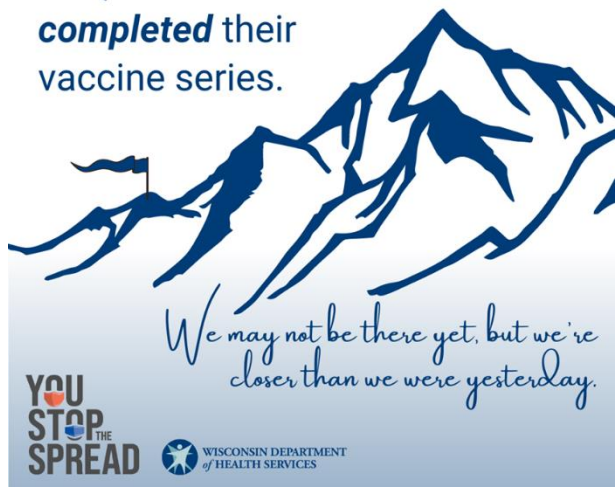
- Frontline health care personnel
- Residents and employees in skills nursing and long-term care facilities
- Police and fire personnel, correctional staff
- Adults ages 65 and older

From Wisconsin DHS:

More than 250,000 Wisconsinites have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19. We hit 100,000 at the end of January and have added another 150,000 since. With limited supply, it will take time for everyone who wants the vaccine to be able to get it. The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.
