

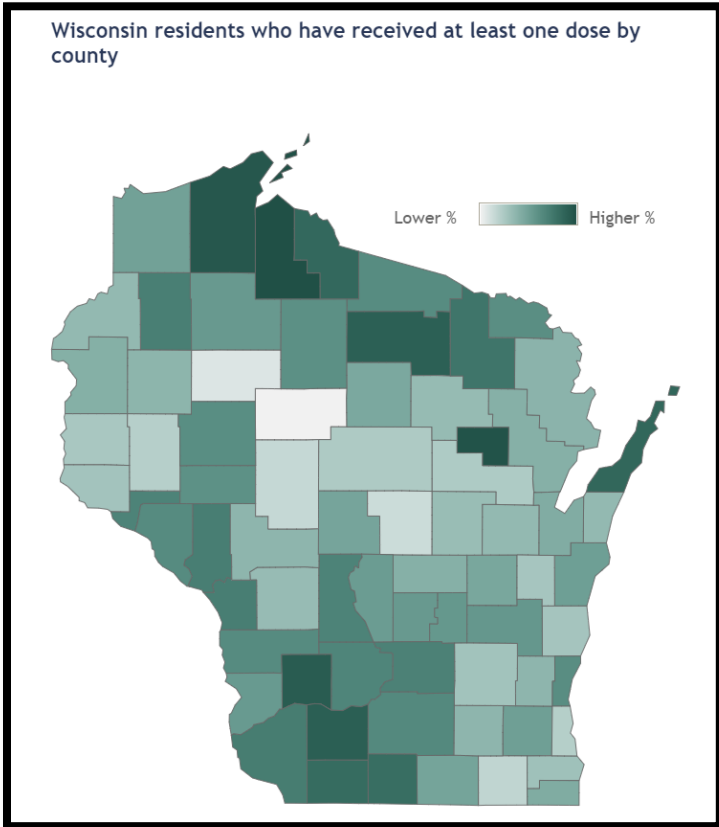


North Shore Health Department Public Briefing

NSHD Vaccination Progress: North Shore Health Department began vaccinating eligible individuals on 1/12/2021. As of Friday, February 19th, 2,200 doses of vaccine have been administered. The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.
