Walgreens COVID-19 Vaccinations: Select locations are providing the vaccine to currently eligible populations in Wisconsin.



To see if you are eligible and to find an appointment:

- 1. Sign in to your Walgreens.com pharmacy account. Don't have an account? No problem. Creating one is quick and easy.
- 2. Complete a short eligibility screening.
- 3. If you are eligible, they will look for available appointments in your area for your COVID-19 vaccination appointment.

Other options to check eligibility:

- Call 1-800-WALGREENS and select Option 1; or
- Call your local Walgreens pharmacy.

NSHD Vaccination Update: Beginning March 1st, <u>new groups will be eligible</u> for the COVID-19 vaccine. The newly eligible groups include the following in priority order:

- Education and child care staff
- Individuals enrolled in Medicaid long-term care programs
- Some public-facing essential workers
- Non-frontline essential health care personnel
- Facility staff and residents in congregate living settings.

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.

While these groups are eligible on March 1st, WI Department of Health Services has advised vaccine providers to prioritize previously eligible groups before newer groups. This means individuals in newly eligible groups should not expect to get the vaccine right away. It will take time to get to everyone in priority order. As stated in previous communications, COVID-19 vaccine supply is limited. North Shore Health Department is expecting 396 doses of vaccine for the week of March 1st. NSHD will continue to prioritize previously eligible groups while also beginning vaccinations for those working in education and childcare in the North Shore.
