The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test - if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.

As of March 11, a total of 7,306 samples have been sequenced to identify variant strains. The B.1.1.7 variant has been identified 31 times, the B.1.351 variant one time, and the P.1. variant has not been identified.
