The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will arrive in Milwaukee on Monday. March 15 to assist with COVID-19 vaccinations at the Wisconsin Center. As a result, the Wisconsin Center clinic will be open to eligible individuals living and working throughout the region. Individuals meeting the eligibility criteria can sign up for vaccination appointments through the health department's scheduling portal and vaccine information hub at milwaukee.gov/covidvax. People without internet access can schedule appointments by calling 414-286-6800.
