



North Shore Health Department Public Briefing

March 15th, 2021 as of 4:00 p.m.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will arrive in Milwaukee on Monday, March 15 to assist with COVID-19 vaccinations at the Wisconsin Center. As a result, the Wisconsin Center clinic will be open to eligible individuals living and working throughout the region. Individuals meeting the eligibility criteria can sign up for vaccination appointments through the health department's scheduling portal and vaccine information hub at [milwaukee.gov/covidvax](https://www.milwaukee.gov/covidvax). People without internet access can schedule appointments by calling 414-286-6800.

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.

COVID-19 VACCINE: WHO IS ELIGIBLE IN WISCONSIN?

CURRENTLY ELIGIBLE GROUPS IN PRIORITY ORDER

- Frontline health care personnel
- Residents and staff in skilled nursing and long-term care facilities



- Police and fire personnel, correctional staff
- Age 65 and older



- Educators and child care
- People enrolled in Medicaid long-term care programs
- Some public facing essential workers
- Non-frontline essential health care personnel
- Staff and residents in congregate living facilities



NEXT ELIGIBLE GROUPS

MARCH 29

People age 16 and older with certain medical conditions known to be associated with an increased risk of severe illness from COVID-19.

MAY

Everyone age 16 and older.
