**Gating Criteria:** To determine when to transition to the next phase, gating criteria will be monitored on the Milwaukee County Office of Emergency Management [Dashboard](#) under the "Key Indicators" tab. After 14 days of Phase B, the gating criteria will be reevaluated to determine if it is safe to move forward. When all five of the criteria are green or yellow, the North Shore will prepare to move to the next phase.

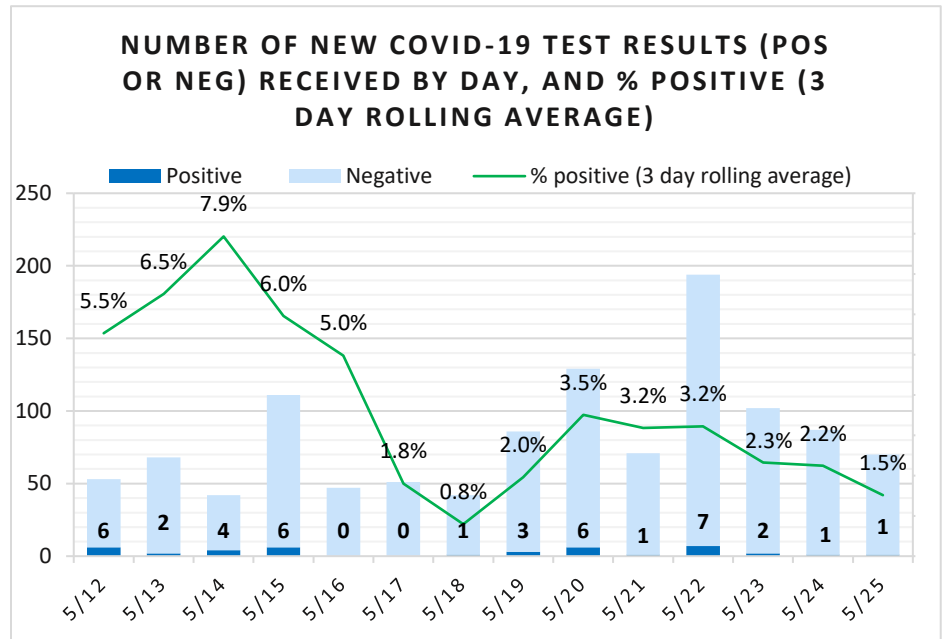

This graph displays the total number of positive and negative test results received per day in the North Shore, as well as the percent of test results that were positive (3 day rolling average). A total of 2,645 COVID-19 tests have been conducted in the North Shore as of 3:30 p.m. on May 26<sup>th</sup>. With a population of approximately 65,000 in the North Shore, this indicates that 4.1% of the North Shore population has been tested at this time.
