

Campgrounds at Wisconsin State Parks are now open: The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) announced that camping is now available at WI State Parks starting June 10th. Reservations are required for all campsites and may be made online or by calling 1-888-947-2757. Property offices will remain closed and campers should head directly to their reserved campsite upon arrival and use the automated check-in system. The rules for WI State Park campgrounds can be found here. Remember to practice physical distancing to the extent possible when visiting campgrounds.



This graph displays the total number of positive and negative test results received per day in the North Shore, as well as the percent of test results that were positive (3 day rolling average). A total of approximately 4,202 COVID-19 tests have been conducted in the North Shore as of 2:00 p.m. on June 11th. With a population of approximately 65,000 in the North Shore, this indicates that 6.5% of the North Shore population has been tested at this time.
