Herd Immunity and COVID-19: Herd immunity occurs when a large proportion of the population is considered immune to a disease, either due to previous infection or vaccination, and this helps contain the spread of disease by reducing the number of susceptible individuals. It is estimated that at least 70% of the population would need to have immunity to achieve herd immunity for COVID-19. Even locations that have been greatly burdened by COVID-19 are nowhere near 70% of the population having been infected and potentially being immune. At this time, only about 20% of New York City residents have had COVID-19. Reaching herd immunity at 70% in the United States would mean at least 230 million people would need to be infected at some point, likely resulting in many more deaths. It is also not quaranteed that prior infection will confer lasting immunity. Vaccines are in development and an effective vaccine would allow us to reach herd immunity in a safe and effective way. For now, slowing the spread of COVID-19 by physically distancing, wearing masks and practicing proper hygiene is the best way to protect yourself and those around you.


