You do **NOT** need to have symptoms.

When you pre-register, you will be asked to read the National Guard's verbal consent form. The eligibility on the form indicates you need to have symptoms or a referral to get tested. This is not necessary. **Testing is open to ALL.**
You do not need to fill out the form. We will do so on site.

Please arrive within your 15 minute time slot, not before or after, to prevent delays.
Children under 5 years old will not be tested.

Total ever hospitalized = 52 (17.8% of all positive cases) - compared to statewide rate of 12%

IT'S THE 4TH OF JULY

Remember to stay safe while celebrating

Stay at least 6 feet apart from others

Wear face coverings around others
