If you were in close contact with someone that has tested positive for COVID-19, you should quarantine and monitor for symptoms for 14 days. If you get tested during your 14-day quarantine period and you test negative, this does not mean your quarantine is over. It is still possible that you could develop disease after testing negative because the incubation period is 14 days. The 14-day quarantine should be completed even with a negative test during your quarantine. If you choose to get tested or your employer requires a negative test to return to work, the most effective time to get tested would be after your 14-day quarantine period is over.

According to WI DHS, you are a "close contact" if <u>any</u> of the following situations happened while you spent time with the person with COVID-19, even if they didn't have symptoms:

- Had direct physical contact with the person (for example, a hug, kiss, or handshake).
- Were within 6 feet of the person for a total of more than 15 minutes in a single day.
- Had contact with the person's respiratory secretions (for example, coughed or sneezed on; contact with a
 dirty tissue; shared a drinking glass, food, towels, or other personal items).
- Live with the person or stayed overnight for at least one night in a household with the person.

Limit Gatherings and Social Events: The number of active cases of COVID-19 is continuing to rise within the North Shore every day, which could pose significant impacts on reopening plans throughout the rest of the year. **Social gatherings and events must be limited to minimize the spread of COVID-19.** More information is available on the CDC website on considerations for events and gatherings.

This graph shows the number of new cases of COVID-19 by day in the North Shore, along with the 7-day average of the number of new cases per day. We have observed a rapid increase in the number of new cases per day since early July.
