WHY YOU SHOULD WEAR A CLOTH FACE MASK



Wearing a cloth face mask is one of the most effective ways to reduce person to person transmission of COVID-19 because it serves as a barrier to prevent respiratory droplets from entering the air. This is known as source control.

Cloth face masks are most effective at reducing the transmission of COVID-19 when they are widely used by the public and used in combination with other preventive measures, including physical distancing and proper hygiene practices. You should wear a face mask in all public settings, especially in indoor spaces where physical distancing is difficult to maintain.



- Wash your hands before putting on your face covering
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face

As of 12:00 p.m. on July 8th, there have been **64 confirmed cases** of COVID-19 among people **ages 20 to 29** in the North Shore. Back on June 10th, there had been 33 cumulative confirmed cases among that age group. Therefore, cases have nearly doubled among 20 to 29-year olds in the North Shore in just under a month, a similar trend to that of the statewide increase in cases among younger people. As seen in the graph to the right, those aged 20 to 29 make up 19% of all cumulative confirmed COVID-19 cases in the North Shore.
