CDC Study of COVID-19 Transmission at Camp in Georgia: A total of 597 Georgia residents, plus 27 others, attended an overnight camp in Georgia, with staff starting on June 17 and campers on June 21. On June 23, a staff member left due to the development of chills the night before and then tested positive for COVID-19 on June 24. Campers began going home June 24 and the camp closed June 27.

Some Key Points and Findings:

- Cloth masks were required for staff members, but not campers.
- Camp attendees were in cabin cohorts and engaged in a variety of indoor and outdoor activities, including daily singing and cheering.
- The median camper age was 12 years (range = 6–19 years) and the median age of staff members and trainees was 17 years (range = 14–59 years).
- 344 (58%) test results were available. 260 (76%) of these were positive. Attack rate = 44% (260 of 597).
- Among 136 cases with available symptom data, 36 (26%) patients reported no symptoms.
