The WI Department of Health Services reported the Wisconsin COVID-19 percent positivity rate was 17.6% for today. This is calculated by taking the total number of positive tests divided by all tests done (positive and negative results). This is the highest daily percent positive reported for the State of Wisconsin. Overall, 88.7% of all confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Wisconsin have recovered, 1.4% have died and 9.9% are currently active cases.

If you attended social gatherings, travelled or spent time with non-household members over Labor Day weekend, it is recommended you monitor for symptoms of COVID-19. The most common symptoms include:

- Cough (new onset or worsening of chronic cough)
- Shortness of breath
- Fever
- Chills
- Sore throat
- Runny nose
- Muscle pain
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell

If you develop symptoms or you are notified that you were in close contact with someone that tested positive for COVID-19, we recommend you seek testing and self-quarantine to avoid exposing others. More information on isolation and quarantine: Click Here
