The risk of severe illness due to COVID-19 increases significantly with age. Severe illness also increases the risk of being hospitalized. To mitigate risk and protect yourself, older individuals and individuals with other underlying illnesses should take steps to reduce their chance of contracting COVID-19.

Suggestions from CDC for older adults:

- Limit your interactions with people outside of vour household
- However, if you do choose to visit with family and friends: delay or cancel visit with them if you or they are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or have been in contact with a COVID-19 positive case within the last 14 davs
- If you feel ill or have symptoms of COVID-19, • get in touch with your health provider within 24 hours
- Wear a mask, social distance, and handwash often
- Avoid others and public places where masks are not being worn
- Keep interactions with others brief, outside (if possible, if not in a well-ventilated space), and spaced at least 6 feet apart
- Avoid hugging, shaking hands, or kissing others outside of your household
