Proper Mask Wearing

To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, wearing a mask is a simple habit that can help keep you and your community safe. However, how you wear your mask matters. Follow these helpful tips to ensure you are wearing a mask properly:

DO'S:

- Do wash your hands for 20 seconds before putting on your mask
- Do wear a mask that covers your mouth and nose, ideally with it secured under your chin
- Do wear a mask that fits snugly to your face, but still allows you to breath easily
- Do wear your mask if you are in a public setting or if you are indoors/near others who are not members of your household

DON'TS:

- Don't wear your mask on your forehead or pulled down to your chin – moving the mask up or down on your face could potentially spread germs from the mask into your mouth, nose, or eyes
- Don't wear a mask that does not fully cover both your mouth and nose
- Don't touch your mask or face while wearing the mask – if you do, wash your hands for 20 seconds or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer if you are unable to wash your hands immediately

The antigen positives may be confirmed with a PCR test – if the PCR test is positive, they are added to the confirmed cases. If the PCR test is negative, they are no longer considered antigen positive.
